In November we visited Carrickfergus YMCA for our 3rd meet up. We discussed what Gets Active means to us and how the Gets Active key components work together to positively impact the participants from our clubs through holiday provision and weekly activities in clubs. We had an insight to the work which is going on around the UK to tackle food insecurity and how we can take learning from other organisations.

We went away with a fact finding task to see what our members from each club thought about the cost of living. At our December meeting, we stayed in Portadown where YAG participants came to Oasis/SSYCC/Uniting Communities Christmas trip to The Rink. Their action for this month was to encourage young people to fill in a questionnaire on their thoughts, opinions and experiences of food insecurity and the cost of living.

With help from staff, the young people excelled in approaching their peers, engaging with them in conversation and encouraging them to take part in our 'Guess The Sweets In The Jar' competition which was a huge hit as well as getting them to fill in the questionnaires. We are currently working on gathering the data and analysing the results!

We look forward to our visit to Dry Arch Group in January to continue building relationships and working towards change in our communities!

Week 2

Everyone got the chance to learn some facts about ancient Egyptian Hieroglyphs, write their names and to decipher some pre – made sentences. A first for many this was enjoyed by all of the group with some doing some more when they got home.

Week 3




CHRISTMAS GETS ACTIVE: WINTER VILLAGE 2022
